

What research questions are important to you?

We are seeking input on the areas that matter the most for future research about medicine use in people living with dementia.

This survey builds on the one we did last year. In 2020, we asked people to tell us their questions and concerns about medicines use in people living with dementia. We received potential research questions from over 230 people across Australia. We now need to know which of the questions are priorities.

We would like to hear from:

- People living with dementia
- Carers, family members and friends of a person living with dementia
- Healthcare professionals (including students) and/or staff members of healthcare organisations (including healthcare workers) who have any experience providing or facilitating care for people with dementia.

Participation in this study will involve filling in an anonymous questionnaire. It will take you about 5-10 minutes.

To be eligible for this study you need to be at least 18 years old and Australian OR living and/or working in Australia.
