

Diversity Small Grants Application Form 2025

Funding Guidelines and Application Process

Dementia Australia is committed to working with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) community groups, to enhance their access to culturally appropriate dementia information and support. As part of this commitment, Dementia Australia is offering small grant opportunities of up to \$30,000 as a one-off payment, to organisations or groups that support Australian Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander or CALD communities, to raise awareness of dementia in their community, their way.

The purpose of these grants is to support local delivery of activities that increase community awareness and understanding of dementia and provide information about dementia-related support options for their community members. We encourage organisations to propose activities that will be appropriate and meaningful for the specific community they are representing.

In addition to the grant money, successful organisations will receive one

free professional dementia information session for their staff or committee members. The information session will help staff gain a greater understanding of dementia, empowering them to confidently discuss dementia-related topics with their community members.

Throughout the funding period, Dementia Australia will remain available to provide support and guidance to the successful grant recipient.

Grant Round Opening and Closing Dates

- + The grant round opens 21 July 2025 and will close 13 August 2025 at 5pm (AEST).
- + All applicants will receive an email to confirm their application has been received.
- + Successful grant applicants will be invited to sign their contract by 9 October 2025.
- + The free information session should be completed before 7 December 2025.
- + The project funded by this grant must be completed by 12 June 2026.

Eligibility

The selection process will prioritise applications that:

- + Target the needs of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities and/or CALD communities.
- + Are led by Australian Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people or people from a CALD background.
- + Demonstrate specific, measurable, achievable, realistic and time sensitive outcomes.

Funds (up to \$30,000) can be used to cover the costs of salaries, consultancies (e.g., translation services), printing, postage, event costs, catering, room hire, supplies and small equipment.

Administration overheads, construction and large equipment purchase costs are ineligible. Residential Aged care agencies and University led projects are **not** eligible to apply.

- + Please answer all the questions listed in the Application Form, from page 3 of this document.
- + Please write short answers (no more than 150 words) to each of the questions. We encourage the use of dot-points to meet the word count limit.
- + Please only submit the application form and **do not** provide any additional documents. We will contact you if we need any further information.
