# SHARING YOUR EXPERIENCES OF LIVING WITH ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE, DEMENTIA OR MCI

## WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

- People living with mild Alzheimer's disease, signs of mild dementia or MCI
- Family members or carers (over age 18) of people living with Alzheimer's disease, signs of dementia or MCI

- Take part in a 30 to 60-minute interview conducted over telephone or a video conference platform such as Microsoft Teams; and/or

## WHAT QUESTIONS WILL I BE ASKED?

- What was your journey towards an AD, dementia or MCI diagnosis?
- What was your and your family's experience with managing the outcome of the diagnosis?
- What impact does AD, signs of dementia or MCI have on your life and the lives of your family?
- How has AD, signs of dementia or MCI influenced your mental health and wellbeing?
- How you think about your experience and your family's experience with your condition today?



## HOW WILL MY INFORMATION BE USED?

- Your interview and/or survey data will be used to inform a report about the broader impacts of AD on society, from a humanistic economic perspective.
- No personal details will be shared and anything you share will remain anonymous.
- The report will be made public by Roche Diagnostics Australia Pty Ltd to inform additional research and the potential impact of improvements in diagnosis for AD.

All interview participants will be reimbursed for their time and participation.

The research is being commission by Roche Diagnostics Australia Pty Ltd and will be undertaken by the research agency **HT**ANALYSTS. This study has been approved by Bellberry Human Research Ethics Committee in accordance with the National Statement on Ethical Conduct in Human Research (2023) (HREC 00430, approval number: 2025-07-1079).
